II. SELF-EVALUATION BASED ON THE CRITERIA FOR QUALITY ASSESSMENT

1. TEACHERS, SUPERVISORS, RESEARCH CAPACITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE

1.1. The HEI is distinguished by its scientific achievements in the discipline in which the doctoral study programme is delivered

When speaking of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, one should consider the following: a) the study programme has been active for ten years; b) the study programme was not conceived on the project basis; c) the doctoral candidates do not enrol in the study programme with a developed scientific research, but they reach the topic of the doctoral dissertation during the studies. There is no legislation which regulates the structure of doctoral studies described under b) and c). Rather, they present the "examples of good practice" which were not discussed at the moment of launching the doctoral studies as part of the reformed higher education system following the signing of the Bologna Charter.

The extent to which the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity is distinguished depends on the extent to which its issuing institution is distinguished, and the extent to which the teachers involved in its delivery are represented in the academic community. On 17 May 2016, the Agency for Science and Higher Education awarded the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek a certificate of quality, thereby confirming that the Faculty is incessantly working on improving the two of its most important activities – student education and research work. The Head of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity

The current head of the study programme is Dr. Milovan Tatarin, Full Professor with Tenure. In 2006, he composed the first study programme, and in the period between 2013 and 2014 he instigated amendments to the programme, wherein he followed – where possible – the conclusions of the *Report on the Thematic Evaluation of Doctoral Studies in the Republic of Croatia* (February 2014), and the *Ordinance on Studies and Studying at the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of Osijek* (Consolidation, July 2013) (Articles 80-118), especially Article 98, which recommends the manner of structuring curricular and extracurricular contents (30% : 70%).

In 2013, he suggested the creation of the programme web page (and has been in charge of its administration) as well as the initiating of the procedure of signing a co-operation agreement with the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Zagreb, in the implementation of postgraduate university study programmes, which was signed on 29 April 2015 at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek.

Within the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, Dr. Milovan Tatarin teaches the following courses: *Textology* and *Marin Držić and Machiavelli*.

He participated in 36 Croatian and international scientific conferences, he wrote 68 scientific and professional papers, he published 10 books (7 scientific and 3 professional titles), and he prepared the introduction for 6 books. Together with Slobodan P. Novak, Mirjana Mataija, and Leo Rafolt, he edited the capital *Marin Držić Lexicon*, published in 2009 by the Miroslav Krleža Lexicographic Institute.

He participated as an associate in the following scientific-research projects: *Corpus Strossmayeranum: prosvjetna, kulturna i umjetnička baština* [*Corpus Strossmayeranum: the Educational, Cultural, and Artistic Heritage*] (5-12-182, 1991-1995, headed by: Stanislav Marijanović, PhD), *Corpus Strossmayeranum – Fontes* (122011, 1998–2002, headed by: Stanislav Marijanović, PhD), *Leksikon hrvatske književne culture* 16. *stoljeća* [*The Lexicon of the* 16th *Century Croatian Literary Culture*] (0130403, 2002–2006, headed by: Davor Dukić, PhD, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Zagreb), *Književni dokumentarizam u Slavoniji* [*Slavonian Literary Documentarism*] (0122008, 2002–2008, headed by: Dr. Helena Sablić Tomić, Full Professor, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek), *Rubni žanrovi hrvatske književnosti* 18. *stoljeća* [*Marginal Genres in Croatian* 18th Century Literature] (122–1222665–2677, 2007–2013, headed by: Zlata Šundalić, PhD, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek).

In 2014, the Croatian Science Foundation supported his project titled *Panorama hrvatske književnosti u Dubrovniku* [A Panorama of Croatian Literature in 17th Century Dubrovnik] (8110).

In 2013, he devised and initiated the *Open Thursday*, monthly popular-scientific lectures by teachers, students, and doctoral candidates of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek, as well as by all interested community members.

Teaching Staff in the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity

The teachers involved in the delivery of the study programme teach at various departments: Department of Croatian Language and Literature, Department of English Language and Literature, Department of German Language and Literature, Department of Psychology, Department of Information Sciences, Department of Philosophy, Department of Hungarian Language and Literature. The inclusion of teachers from "non-literary" departments had the aim of achieving at least a minimum level of interdisciplinarity. So far, only two moderately interdisciplinary doctoral dissertations have been defended within the programme: Dejan Varga's *Oblikovanje identiteta u filmovima Pedra Almodóvara* [Identity Formation in *Pedro Almodóvar's Movies*] (24 February 2015) and Nadira Puškar Mustafić's Katarzični efekti suvremene auto/biografske američke drame [Cathartic Effects in Contemporary Auto/Biographical American Drama] (5 June 2017).

All the teaching staff hold the required research-teaching ranks, and the list of their participation in scientific conferences and that of published scientific works in the period from 2012 to 2017 (Annex 8 and Annex 9) exhibit them as very active researchers:

Although one should by all means strive for greater visibility, we must not at any point ignore the original context in which certain scientific topics play an important role. The fact that the truly relevant scientific production is not registered in the abovementioned international databases does not denote its quality; rather, it testifies of a different manner of positioning knowledge in the global knowledge market. Undoubtedly, certain topics have no meaning in the international fictional context, however, they are extremely important within the framework of Croatian science and culture. In short: where will the topics of national literature, from all of its time periods, from both canonical writers and those small and forgotten collections of works, be researched if not in the Republic of Croatia, notwithstanding whether that research shall be reflected in any of the citation databases. We cannot consider domestic research as insignificant only because it is not registered in the internet sources.

In general, projects present the weaker side of the Croatian higher education. Following the awareness on potential issues (small number of serious project providers, complex submitting procedure, uncertainty regarding the approval of a project etc.), the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity was not conceived on a project platform, neither in regard to teachers nor to doctoral candidates. The amended programme entails participation in a scientific project (preparation of a scientific article, participation at workshops, researching in libraries and archives, etc.), for which the doctoral candidate can acquire 15 ECTS credits. However, this presents only one among the possible extracurricular activities, not a *conditio sine qua non*.

In the period covered by the Self-Evaluation, nine teachers received an approval for their projects and became associate researchers in the projects conducted elsewhere. The projects were submitted without the intention of including doctoral candidates, neither those who would write their doctoral dissertation within the project, nor those who attended the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity:

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Only the project of Dr. Biljana Oklopčić, Associate Professor, included a doctoral candidate – Lucija Saulić – as member.

The project of Dr. Željko Uvanović, Full Professor, had an international dimension with a guest researcher, Kamilla Elliott from the University of Lancaster, UK. The project resulted in the international conference titled *Adaptation: Theory, Criticism, Pedagogy* (https://sokrat.ffos.hr/adaptation/), organized by Ž. Uvanović and Dr. Ljubica Matek, Assistant Professor. The conference was open for participation to doctoral candidates: Jelena Pataki was a member of the organizing committee, she participated in the creation of the book of abstracts, and presented in co-operation with Dr. Ljubica Matek on the following topic: "From 'Crash!' to Crash: Adapting the Adaptation."¹⁵ The doctoral candidate Božena Pandža Mandurić presented the topic: "Aspects of Death in Film Adaptation (2013) of Markus Zusak's 'The Book Thief' (2005)."

The analysis provides the following reasons for satisfaction:

- 1) The number of teachers from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences allows for a quality delivery of the doctoral programme
- 2) The teachers come from different departments, allowing for at least a minimum level of interdisciplinarity in the delivery of the doctoral programme¹⁶
- 3) The teachers possess satisfactory competencies in the field of their specialty interest (within which they applied for the delivery of a course)
- 4) The teachers are very active regarding the national scientific work, which is at times reflected internationally
- 5) The doctoral candidates have access to a large number of potential supervisors
- 6) The doctoral candidates are allowed to gradually develop the topic of their doctoral dissertation.

Necessary improvements:

- 1) Striving toward the internationalization of national topics by publishing papers in English
- 2) Connecting with other European faculties: inviting foreign teachers to give short guest lectures, initiating projects involving foreign associates
- 3) Obtaining strategic friendships so as to enable a targeted sending of doctoral candidates to foreign doctoral programmes
- 4) Providing projects and including doctoral candidates in their delivery.

Doctoral candidates

The doctoral candidates who completed the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity have devoted themselves to scientific research disproportionately, just as they had

¹⁶ The Bologna System is not prone to interdisciplinarity: its insistence on one-semester courses, fragmented and disconnected knowledge, and specific facts which never make up a whole has wrecked the neo-humanist concept of education as a system. True interdisciplinarity requires a professional who is equally competent at two (or more) disciplines, which the contemporary higher education does not allow for. To reproach the lack of interdisciplinarity means to address a wider implicit system criticism.

different motivations while enrolling in the study programme. Certain postgraduate graduates were already employed at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences when they enrolled in the doctoral studies (Tatjana Ileš, Jasna Poljak Rehlicki, Ljubica Matek, Tina Varga Oswald, Ivana Pepić), therefore the Faculty financed their education. Other doctoral candidates were noticed and following the defence of their doctoral dissertation obtained employment with the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (Stephanie Jug, Sonja Novak). Several candidates obtained employment with another HEI in Osijek: Alen Biskupović and Katarina Žeravica at the Academy of Arts, and Valentina Majdenić and Vedrana Živković Zebec at the Faculty of Education.

The doctoral candidates' scientific production is provided in the tables under sections 4.4. and 4.8.

1.2. The number and workload of teachers involved in the study programme ensure quality doctoral education

The teaching in the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity is delivered by 21 teachers, employees of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek. The teaching also includes two teachers from the Academy of Arts in Osijek and five teachers from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Zagreb, with which the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences signed the Agreement on Co-Operation between Postgraduate University Studies. This means that 75% of teaching staff is made up of teachers from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences and 25% are external associates.

The teachers from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek offer 45 courses, while external associates offer 10 courses. During the course of the studies, the doctoral candidate is obliged to attend 3 core courses and 12 elective courses, meaning that the teachers from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek can cover up to 100% of the study programme. However, the practice of involving experts from other institutions has not been discontinued in order to provide students with an opportunity to familiarize with different methodological approaches and scientific topics.

The study programme teaching is delivered in the following scope: 8 hours of lectures and 4 hours of seminars, whereby the teacher holds 4 hours of lectures while the rest of the instruction is delivered in an individual-consultative form, meaning that the doctoral candidate – since there are few candidates in a group; at times only one doctoral candidate elects a certain course – studies the recommended literature on their own, and later discusses it with the teacher. Seminar assignments result in a written work, allowing for these two aspects: the doctoral candidates are being accustomed to a more extensive written articulation of the topic which serves them as a preparation for writing the doctoral dissertation; the doctoral candidates apply the researched theoretical literature to literary works, thus practicing their interpretation within the framework of a certain methodological approach. Often, the value of these works is such that they can be published.

1.3. The teachers are highly qualified researches who actively engage with the topics they teach, providing a quality doctoral programme

All the teaching staff involved in the delivery of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity have been appointed into research-teaching ranks ranging from assistant professors to full professors. They are involved in the delivery of the study programme by teaching the courses which are most closely associated with their professional interests, and often represent the topics they researched in their doctoral dissertations. Within the postgraduate study programme, they can explore and articulate topics that are not suitable for the undergraduate and graduate level of studies, which is the basis of the innovativeness of the Literature and Cultural Identity study programme: enabling the domestic teachers to extend the boundaries of research topics in collaboration with doctoral students. Annex 9 exhibits the scientific engagement of teachers; the pace of their publication of papers, as well as the types of publication confirm that the teachers contribute to the quality of the study programme through their own professional improvement and advancement.

1.4. The number of supervisors and their qualifications provide for quality in producing the doctoral thesis

The Ordinance on Postgraduate Studies at the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of Osijek (Art. 29) and the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity (Art. 14) define the appointment of a supervisor:

- a teacher who holds the research-teaching rank of (assistant, associate or full professor) or a researcher appointed to the research rank of (research associate, senior research associate or research advisor) or an equivalent rank if the potential supervisor attained the academic rank abroad;
- a person who has been appointed to research or research-teaching rank and is actively involved in scientific research in the field of research of the doctoral dissertation;
- a person who has accomplished scientific achievements in the last five years and has published relevant research papers related to the research topic of the doctoral dissertation,
- a professor emeritus who participates in teaching at doctoral studies,
- a person who is a renowned international researcher and is not employed at the Faculty, but, under a separate contract, is involved in teaching at the doctoral studies or is the manager or associate of a scientific research project within the framework of which the research would be done and the doctoral dissertation would be written.

The supervisor : doctoral candidate ratio is below 1:3

All the teachers in the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity can assume the function of a supervisor, meaning that currently there are 21 potential supervisors. Since the study programme and the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity (IV.5., Articles 13, 14, and 15) ensure freedom in choosing a supervisor, the doctoral candidate can choose the one who is the most competent in regard to the topic of their future doctoral dissertation. The head of the doctoral studies encourages candidates to choose among the teachers from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek, thereby taking into account the correspondence between the teacher's research work and the doctoral dissertation topic.

Publications relevant for the programme study area and field

The Doctoral Degree Committee ensures that the future supervisor proves their competencies with a minimum of five research papers published in the past five years related to the research topic of the doctoral dissertation. Yet, the connection is not to be defined too narrowly since it is hard to expect that the teacher is engaged in the same topic which is to be researched by the doctoral candidate. Therefore, during the process of choosing a suitable supervisor, the following characteristics are to be taken into account: the time period, particular genre, methodological approach, etc.

The section 1.1. provides a list of teachers who headed or participated in the implementation of a project in the past five years. The projects – as has already been said – were not connected to the delivery of the doctoral studies.

Doctoral candidates' successfulness / the number of postgraduate graduates of a certain supervisor It is not possible to describe a successful co-operation between the doctoral candidate and supervisor in simple terms. Generally, a successful supervisor is the one who leads the doctoral candidate all the way to the defence of the doctoral dissertation, but also the one whose doctoral candidate is agile in the scientific sense; who publishes papers and participates in scientific conferences, wherein these activities are usually not directly connected with the supervisor. Generally, the previous supervisors within the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity have successfully completed their supervisory obligations. Statistically, this looks like this:

1.5. The HEI has developed methods of assessing the qualifications and competencies of teachers and supervisors

The formal mechanisms in the procedure of selecting qualified teachers are primarily related to the Regulations on the Promotion into Research-Teaching Ranks of the National Council for Science, Higher Education and Technological Development, and the required conditions for the evaluation of teaching and research activity in the procedure of promotion and repeated promotion prescribed by the Rector's Board. The Doctoral Degree Committee in the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity has developed certain indicators, which to a certain degree enable it to monitor the scientific excellence of teachers and supervisors:

- a) the semestral survey on course relevance and teacher effectiveness
- b) the supervisor's annual report on the progress of writing the doctoral dissertation
- c) the supervisory workshop.

At the end of each semester, the doctoral candidates fill out a survey in which they express their satisfaction level concerning teachers and courses they took. The Quality Assurance Office conducts a statistical analysis of the surveys, after which the head of the study programme submits a composite report to the Doctoral Degree Committee. In the report, he presents the relevant data, such as the assessment on the applicability of knowledge or the teacher's encouragement of active participation during lectures, which is especially emphasized within the study programme since it allows for the development of generic skills. In addition, the report includes recommendations in relation to the students' comments. The surveys, statistical processing, and reports are duly archived.

The supervisor submits the annual report before December 20 of the current year. In the report, the supervisor evaluates the research aim and hypotheses, research methodology, referenced works, and respecting of the ethical standards of research. The supervisor submits the report even in those cases when the doctoral candidate – due to reasons we cannot know – does not seek the supervisor's co-operation. Although the annual reports are conceived as places where, following the principles of reality and morality, the doctoral candidate's progress is described, certain supervisors have not fulfilled their obligations in a professional manner (Dr. Sanja Nikčević, Full Professor, and Dr. Željko Uvanović, Full Professor). Consequently, their reports are too general and do not provide an insight into the doctoral candidate's work.

With the aim of increasing the supervisors' (and future supervisors') competencies, the teachers involved in the delivery of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity attended the so-called Supervisory Workshop which consisted of three workshops:

- a) Online Databases and Biometric Indicators Dr. Kornelija Petr Balog, Full Professor, and Gordana Gašo, Senior Librarian
- b) The European Charter for Researchers and a Code of Conduct for the Recruitment of Researchers Dr. Tanja Gradečak Erdeljić, Associate Professor
- c) Ethical Standards of Research Dr. Zoran Velagić, Associate Professor

The Doctoral Degree Committee has decided that, from this year onwards, the doctoral candidates are obliged to submit an annual report on the co-operation with the supervisor until December 20. The form is located on the programme web page.

2. INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE OF THE PROGRAMME

2.1. The HEI has established and accepted effective procedures for proposing, approving, and delivering doctoral education. The procedures include the identification of scientific, cultural, social, and economic needs

The Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity was launched in the 2006/2007 academic year, immediately after the transfer to the Bologna model of higher education. At that time, there was only a general vision of the doctoral studies, and the proponents relied on their own ideas, without an organized institutional supervision (the MSES or ASHE) in relation to what a contemporary doctoral study programme should look like. At the time, the Republic of Croatia had a single postgraduate university study programme in the area of Humanities, in the field of philology: the one at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Zagreb. After the Agency for Science and Higher Education conducted a thematic analysis of doctoral studies in 2013, and published a *Report on the Thematic Evaluation of Doctoral Studies in the Republic of Croatia* in February 2014, the amendments were introduced to the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity. After the amendments were adopted at the Faculty Council's session held on 26 March 2014, the study programme was submitted to the review procedure.

The section 2.3. provides a description of amendments to the study programme.

Although the university study programmes are currently predominant in comparison to professional study programmes in the Republic of Croatia, and while humanities are searching for ways to fit into a new knowledge market – in which the competing knowledge contributes to the economic and technological progress – the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity presents an important element in the process of "teaching the teachers." Namely, it provides education for those who are already involved in the educational process, therefore allowing the acquired knowledge to distribute itself in other educational levels. One should also bear in mind the importance of knowledge in securing the cultural identity, in which the concept of the Postgraduate University Study Program Literature and Cultural Identity fits well.

The validity of the implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity is based primarily on the concept of knowledge related to the preservation of cultural identity. *The Education, Science and Technology Strategy (working material,* 2013) recommends – as a result of the Recommendations of the European Parliament and the Council of the European Union – among other, developing the competencies in the mother tongue, cultural awareness, and expression, wherein the humanities have an important role: "Following Croatia's accession to the European Union, a need was created for presenting the Croatian Humanities outside our borders in order to ensure the Croatian presence and recognisability in the multinational union. However, the need for incessant redefining of the Croatian identity within the Republic of Croatia has not disappeared. Continuous research of national and world cultural heritage and history represents a necessity in a society which is forming its identity on the basis of scientific results." It is precisely on these principles that the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity was conceived and developed.

2.2. The programme is aligned with the HEI research mission and vision, i.e. research strategy The *Development Strategy of the Faculty for the Period 2011-2015* (amended version, September 2013)²¹ defines the Faculty's mission and vision:

MISSION. The mission of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek is to be an active stakeholder in higher education and research in the field of humanities and social sciences. The basic mission of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences is to educate students to meet measurable learning standards and acquire distinct knowledge, professional competencies, and skills. By acquiring knowledge and skills at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, future professionals are trained to be responsible professionals in both individual and team work within the community.

VISION. The Strategic Plan of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences sets off from the idea of the Faculty being a strong regional, international, and national centre of humanities and social sciences with a focus on systematic development and strengthening of its research groups and fostering teaching programmes that offer students knowledge and skills required to meet the challenges of contemporary society.

The Strategy provides for a series of activities, expected outcomes, performance indicators, and mechanisms for monitoring postgraduate study programmes. Thereby, four strategic goals have been established: 1) The teaching process (study programmes, teaching and teachers, students), 2) Research work and international co-operation, 3) Ensuring and improving the education and research-teaching quality system, and 4) Developmental and professional work. Within the second strategy goal, the following sub-goals are established: a) raise the efficiency of the delivery of postgraduate study programmes, b) launch new postgraduate doctoral and professional studies, c) enable doctoral candidates to participate in research, d) ensure a better visibility and dissemination of the doctoral research.

The greater part of the activities envisioned by the *Strategy* has been realized. Namely, the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity were composed, periodic internal surveys are being conducted (the survey on course relevance and teacher effectiveness), as well as the thematic analyses of the Agency for Science and Higher Education, a web page of the postgraduate studies was created, a doctoral guide was written, an inter-university agreement was signed with the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Zagreb, facilitating the doctoral candidates' selection of courses from other doctoral studies of that Faculty, a repository of doctoral dissertations at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek was created and associated with the DART Europe e-Portal of doctoral dissertations repository to ensure the visibility of doctoral research.

The Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity presents an important element of the bigger picture in which the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences wishes to take up an adequate place, not only within the comprehensive network of university cities in the Republic of Croatia, but in the entire region. The programme is structured so as to make use of the potential of its teachers, their professional interests, and methodological affiliations, and to – as much as possible – affirm itself as a distinguished philological programme.

2.3. The HEI systematically monitors the success of the programmes through periodic reviews, and implements improvements

Based on its own practice and the thematic analysis conducted in 2013 by the Agency for Science and Higher Education, at the end of 2013, comprehensive changes were introduced at several levels of the study programme:

The ratio of curricular and extracurricular activities (30% : 70%) was modified, thereby modifying the structure of the programme and the pace of the acquisition of ECTS credits (curricular activities: 60 ECTS credits / extracurricular activities: 120 ECTS credits).

Extracurricular activities were modified: the previous alternative forms (Independent Research, Seminar Workshop I, Seminar Workshop II, Elective Course I, Elective Course II, Elective Course III, and Stylistic Exercises) were replaced with more elaborate and more precisely described activities that require more independent research work.

Core courses have been introduced: Academic Writing, Identity, Writing a Doctoral Dissertation Proposal, and Ethical Standards of Research. Except for those four courses, the rest of the courses are elective.

The public defence of the doctoral dissertation proposal has to take place before an independent committee.

The contact hours pertaining to the courses were altered: the courses in the first semester were delivered during 15 hours of lectures, yet now they are delivered during 8 hours of lectures and 7 hours of seminars; The second, third, and fourth semester courses were delivered during 10 hours of lectures and 5 hours of seminars; now, they are delivered during 8 hours of lectures and 4 hours of seminars.

Learning outcomes have been specified at the level of the study programme and of each course (knowledge and understanding; application of knowledge and understanding; analysis, deduction, decision-making; synthesis and evaluation).

The amended elaboration of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural ldentity suggest forms of a more active inclusion of doctoral candidates in the delivery of instruction at the undergraduate and graduate studies, independent research-scientific work (writing and publishing of original, review, and professional articles, compiling of biographies), participation in scientific conferences, as well as inclusion in research projects, to the extent to which it is possible considering the pace of project applications and financing in the Republic of Croatia. The amended programme introduces courses that enable students to develop competencies in the field of academic prose genres and research methodology, as well as basic knowledge on authorship and academic plagiarism (courses *Academic Writing* and *Ethical Standards of Research*). Finally, models of acquiring ECTS credits through extracurricular activities have been devised, significantly increasing the share of independent research work, which largely contributes to achieving the ultimate goal – writing of the doctoral dissertation.

The amended elaboration of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity was reviewed by a national and an international reviewer.

The 2005/2006 generation enrolled in accordance with the amended programme.

In addition to the surveys conducted at the end of each semester, by means of which doctoral candidates evaluate the course relevance and teacher effectiveness – after which the head of the programme writes a report and suggests recommendations – and the annual supervisors' reports on the progress of the doctoral dissertation, other data are not collected (general satisfaction of postgraduate graduates in relation to their supervisor, reasons for which a part of doctoral candidates did not submit the doctoral dissertation proposal, satisfaction of employees).

2.4. The HEI continuously monitors supervisors' performance and has mechanisms for evaluating supervisors, and, if necessary, changing them and mediating between the supervisors and the candidates

The Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity has several mechanisms with the help of which the monitoring of supervisory work – as much as possible – takes place:

- a) During the process of submitting the doctoral dissertation proposal, the supervisor must prove their competencies in the field of the doctoral dissertation (a list of five papers in the last five years related to the doctoral dissertation topic)
- b) Until December 20 of the calendar year, the supervisor submits the annual report in which they describe the co-operation with the doctoral candidate at four levels: research aim and hypotheses, research methodology, literature, and the respect of ethical standards of research.
- c) Articles 13 to 15 of the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity define the procedures of appointing the supervisor, as well as their obligations toward the doctoral candidates.
- d) Article 16 defines the doctoral candidate's right to change their supervisor or the topic once following the submission of a written request to the Doctoral Degree Committee and a statement by the person who has previously acted as supervisor.

There are no other study programme mechanisms. Considering the circumstances of the study programme – the discontinuity of enrolment, limited number of candidates – the monitoring of the doctoral candidates' success, and consequently the success of their supervisors present an issue of statistical distortion rather than the rule. Upon passing all the exams required by the programme, the doctoral candidates write their dissertations at a very uneven pace, therefore the supervisor can do nothing else but be available when – at times even after many years – the doctoral candidates reappears with a wish to continue writing their dissertation.

After the doctoral candidate has defended the dissertation, the supervisor is rewarded with 3.000 HRK for their work, which is not followed by any additional reward.

2.5. The HEI assures academic integrity and freedom of scientific research

The elements of the European Charter for Researchers have been implemented into the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity in several manners:

- 1. When possible within the concept of the study programme, the doctoral candidates independently form the teaching contents between the second and fourth semester by choosing the courses they wish to attend, which in a way correspond with their wider professional interests, and thus the topic of the future doctoral dissertation.
- 2. The doctoral candidates are offered a variety of extracurricular activities by means of which they can articulate their personal scientific interests, and which are chosen independently as a result of the candidates' personal pretences and circumstances.
- 3. The selection of the doctoral dissertation topic is not conditioned in any way: the doctoral candidate chooses their supervisor independently, whether from the Republic of Croatia or from abroad, if the supervisor is competent in relation to the research topic.
- 4. In the fifth semester, the students attend the course *Ethical Standards of Research*.
- 5. The Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity describe and regulate the procedure of revoking the academic

rank of a PhD or an honorary PhD if it has been determined that the doctoral dissertation is plagiarised or forged (Art. 43 and Art. 44).

6. Before being published on the web page, the originality of the doctoral dissertation is verified with the help of the Ephorus-Software (anti-plagiarism software), provided to all departments by the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of Osijek.

2.6. The process of developing and defending the thesis proposal is transparent and objective, and includes a public presentation

The Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity describe and regulate the procedure of evaluating and defending the doctoral dissertation (Art. 26-30, Art. 36-39):

Article 26

(1) The application with which the doctoral degree procedure is initiated must include as follows: the title of the proposed doctoral dissertation, general information about the doctoral candidate, explanation of the topic, the objective and the hypotheses of the research, methods of research, expected scholarly contribution of the proposed research, data on the proposed supervisor and his or her competencies, a review of previous research, a proposed list of references and a statement that the doctoral candidate has not submitted a dissertation proposal with an identical topic at another University study programme, or at another university.

(2) The topic of the doctoral dissertation is submitted by the student during the fifth semester.

(3) The topic of the doctoral dissertation is submitted in a special form (Form 1).

(4) The Doctoral Degree Committee establishes whether the candidate meets the requirements for initiating the procedure for the acceptance of the doctoral dissertation topic.

(5) If the Doctoral Degree Committee determines that the application does not contain the necessary documentation, it shall require the applicant to supplement the application within a specified period, which may not be longer than 30 days.

(6) Together with the application, the candidate supplies the supervisor's declaration on the validity and feasibility of the proposed doctoral dissertation, as well as on their acceptance of the supervisory position.

Article 27

(1) On the proposal of the Doctoral Degree Committee, the Faculty Council appoints a Committee for the Evaluation of the Dissertation Topic consisting of at least three members, who within 90 days of being appointed submit a report to the Faculty Council (Form 2) with a suggestion for the acceptance or rejection of the proposed dissertation topic.

(2) One member of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Dissertation Topic must be an external member outside the Faculty.

Article 28

 (1) The defence of the doctoral dissertation topic is public. The date and place of the public defence of the topic of the doctoral dissertation is published on the noticeboard and web page of the Faculty.
 (2) The candidate defends the topic of the doctoral dissertation before the Committee for the Evaluation of the Dissertation Topic, the Doctoral Degree Committee, other doctoral students and interested persons.

(3) The public presentation of the doctoral dissertation topic is an integral part of the report and the proposal of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Dissertation Topic.

Article 29

Based on the report and proposal of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Dissertation Topic, the Faculty Council shall make a final decision on accepting or rejecting the proposed doctoral dissertation topic, appoint a supervisor and inform the applicant who has submitted the doctoral dissertation topic.

Article 30

If, on the basis of the Committee's report, the Faculty Council determines that the applicant does not meet the requirements for the doctoral degree or that the proposed topic cannot be accepted, it will reject the applicant's application.

Article 38

(1) The defence of the doctoral dissertation is public.

(2) The date and the place of the dissertation defence is scheduled by the Faculty Council, and the announcement of the dissertation defence is published on the noticeboard and webpage of the Faculty.

(3) The candidate shall defend his or her doctoral dissertation before the Dissertation Defence Committee.

(4) Minutes of the dissertation defence shall be taken (Form 4) and signed by the members of the Committee and the recording secretary.

(5) The decision on the defence of the doctoral dissertation shall be entered in the record.

Article 39

(1) The decision of the Dissertation Defence Committee may be as follows:

- defended by unanimous decision of the Committee,
- defended by a majority vote of the of the Committee, and
- not defended.

(2) The candidate who has successfully defended the doctoral dissertation will be issued a diploma certifying the completion of doctoral studies and awarded a doctoral degree. The diploma includes the scientific field and scientific discipline in which the doctoral degree was obtained as well as the title of the doctoral dissertation.

(3) The candidate who has not defended the doctoral dissertation is entitled after the expiry of 90 days to reapply to write and defend a doctoral dissertation, but not with the same topic.

(4) The subject of the doctoral dissertation that has not been defended within ten years from the date of acceptance of the doctoral dissertation topic is subject to re-assessment.

All documents are available on the programme web page: Form 1 (Doctoral Dissertation Proposal), Form 2 (Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation Topic), Form 3 (Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation), protocol, and the doctoral dissertation defence minutes (Annex 11, 12, 13, and 14).

Except for the dissertation defence minutes, all other documents related to the procedure for obtaining a doctoral degree of each doctoral candidate are uploaded on the programme web page.

At least one month before the defence, the doctoral dissertation is published on the programme web page in order to make it available to the public and thus decrease the possibility of plagiarism.

During the fifth semester and within the course *Writing a Doctoral Dissertation Proposal*, the doctoral candidates gain an insight into the formal side of submitting the doctoral dissertation proposal, as well as of writing and defending the doctoral dissertation.

The programme web page contains the instructions for designing the doctoral dissertation (Annex 15).

The supervisor does not participate in the public defence of the doctoral dissertation.

After the defence of the doctoral dissertation has taken place, and after the candidate has improved and changed the dissertation in accordance with the observations made by the Dissertation Defence Committee (the supervisor is obliged to write a statement verifying that the candidate has indeed done so), the doctoral dissertation is submitted in the printed and electronic form. The electronic form of the dissertation is forwarded to DABAR, the digital repository of doctoral dissertations.²²

2.7. Thesis evaluation results from a scientifically sound assessment of an independent committee

The Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity describe and regulate the procedure of evaluating the doctoral dissertation (Art. 31 to 37):

Article 31

(1) On the proposal of the Doctoral Degree Committee, the Faculty Council appoints a Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation consisting of at least three members.

(2) Members of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation are persons with research rank or with research-and-teaching rank in the respective scientific field of the doctoral dissertation.

Article 32

(1) The members of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation submit a report (Form 3) at the latest within 90 days of the receipt of the dissertation.

(2) The report of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation contains: a description of the dissertation content, opinion and evaluation of the dissertation with reference to the applied methods, the scientific content of the dissertation and the Committee's proposal.

Article 33

The Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation can recommend in their report that:

- the doctoral dissertation should be accepted and the applicant be allowed to proceed to the dissertation defence,
- the doctoral dissertation should be returned to the applicant for supplement or correction,
- the doctoral dissertation should be rejected.

Article 34

(1) If the Faculty Council accepts the report of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation, which determines that the doctoral dissertation has shortcomings that can be amended, it shall require the applicant to make the necessary revisions in accordance with the recommendations and comments of the Committee.

(2) In the case referred to in the preceding paragraph, the applicant is obliged, within 90 days from the date of receipt of the evaluation, to supplement the doctoral dissertation.

(3) If, within 90 days from the date of receipt of the evaluation, the applicant fails to comply with the recommendations and comments of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation

and for this there is no justified reason, the doctoral dissertation shall be deemed rejected.

Article 35

If the Faculty Council concludes that the report of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation does not provide a safe basis for making a decision on the evaluation of the dissertation, it may include new members in the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation and request a report to be submitted or appoint a new Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation, which will reconsider the Doctoral Dissertation and submit a report.

Article 36

(1) After accepting a positive evaluation of the doctoral dissertation, as a rule, at the same session, the Faculty Council appoints the Dissertation Defence Committee consisting of at least three members and two alternate members and schedules the date and place for the defence.

(2) Members of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation can also be members of the Dissertation Defence Committee.

(3) Members of the Dissertation Defence Committee can only be persons with research rank or research-teaching rank.

Article 37

(1) If the report of the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation is negative, and the Faculty Council does not adopt the decision to include new members in the Committee or appoint a new Committee for a new evaluation, the Faculty Council shall adopt the decision to reject the doctoral dissertation and discontinue the procedure for obtaining a doctoral degree as well as to inform the candidate.

(2) The grounds for the committee's decision to terminate the doctoral dissertation process must be communicated to the applicant in writing within 8 days.

(3) In the case referred to in paragraph 1 of this Article, the applicant may not repeat the procedure for obtaining a doctoral degree on the same topic at the Faculty.

The doctoral dissertation is evaluated by the Committee for the Evaluation of the Doctoral Dissertation, which consists of two subject experts employed at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek and – if possible – involved in the delivery of the Postgraduate University Study Programme, and one expert from another institution.

From 2009 to 2017, the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity was successfully completed by 27 doctoral candidates (18 full time doctoral students and 9 candidates outside the doctoral study programme) and all the committees involved external members: Academy of Arts in Osijek; Faculty of Teacher Education in Osijek; Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Zagreb; Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Rijeka; Division for the History of the Croatian Theatre, Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts, Zagreb; The Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts, Center for Scientific Work in Vinkovci; Faculty of Humanities, Pécs; Faculty of Humanities of the Eötvös Loránd University, Budapest; Radford University, VA, USA; Institut für Slawistik, Universität Wien, Austria.

2.8. The HEI publishes all necessary information on the study programme, admissions, delivery and conditions for progression and completion, in accessible outlets and media

For the purpose of the study programme, a web page has been created containing relevant information on the studies. First and foremost, it provides two fundamental documents: the Study Programme of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity and the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity. All current materials are uploaded regularly and timely on the web page: the curriculum, class schedule, documents related to the application and evaluation of the doctoral dissertation topic, as well as the evaluation of the doctoral dissertation.

2.9. Funds collected for the needs of doctoral education are distributed transparently and in a way that ensures sustainability and further development of doctoral education (ensures that candidates' research is carried out and supported, so that doctoral education can be completed successfully)

2.10. Tuition fees are determined on the basis of transparent criteria (and actual costs of studying)

The tuition fee for one semester of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity from 2006 to 2009 amounted to 8.000 HRK, from 2009 to 2012 it amounted to 10.000 HRK, and starting from 2013 it has amounted to 11.670 HRK. Following the decision of the Senate of the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University in Osijek, issued on 27 October 2015 in section 14 of the agenda, the tuition fee includes the compensation for the costs of making graduation degrees and awarding of doctoral degrees (*Decision on Special Remuneration to the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University for making graduation degrees and awarding of doctoral degrees*):

The remuneration to the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of Osijek for making graduation degrees and awarding of doctoral degrees amounting to 1.600,00 HRK is a part of the tuition fee for the postgraduate university (doctoral) study programme, determined by the study programme of the research-teaching constituent, i.e. the Doctoral School that implements the postgraduate university (doctoral) study programme.

Of the said amount, 5% is allocated to the University:

The Ordinance on Financial Management of Josip Juraj Strossmayer University (Osijek, March 2010)

Article 22

Revenues made on the market by the University and the research-teaching/artistic-teaching constituents by performing their own activities are allocated to a specially established University Development Fund as follows:

1. from undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate studies 5%

Of the said amount, 40% is allocated to the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences:

Ordinance on the Allocation of Own Revenues Made on the Market (Consolidation, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Osijek, 25 March 2015):

Article 6

Of the revenue made by the teaching activities:

- 40% is allocated for the promotion of the Faculty's activities (procurement of equipment, literature, investments, and investment maintenance)
- 5% is allocated to the University Development Fund

By means of the Research Fund, the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences provides, among other, subsidies to doctoral candidates (*Decision on the Research Fund of the Faculty of Humanities and Sciences in Osijek*, the 4th session of the Faculty Council in the 2016/2017 academic year, 25 January 2017, item 12):

- Travel costs for lectures, advisory sessions, and exams: 1.500 HRK for national conferences and 3.000 HRK for international conferences during the entire period of studying.
- 2) Copying and binding of the doctoral dissertation: if necessary
- 3) Co-financing of the cost of doctoral studies for best students in the generation: once during the entire period of studying following the decision of the Faculty Administration.

The rest is allocated to the head of the programme and staff involved in the delivery of instruction:

- a) Remuneration for the head of the programme: 5.000 HRK (net profit)
- b) The teachers' hourly rate (per lecture/seminar): 200 HRK (net profit)
- c) Remuneration for the supervisor: 3.000 HRK (per doctoral candidate) (net profit)
- d) Remuneration for the Vice-Dean for Research and International Cooperation: 125 HRK per hour (net profit).

3. SUPPORT TO DOCTORAL CANDIDATES AND THEIR PROGRESSION

3.1. The HEI establishes enrolment quotas with respect to its teaching and supervision capacities The study programme envisions 15 doctoral candidates as the optimal number, and 20 doctoral candidates as the maximum number. Since the programme is delivered by 21 teachers from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek and 6 teachers from other institutions, this is estimated to be a good ratio with respect to the doctoral candidates' individual needs, as well as to the sufficient number of potential supervisors. Since the doctoral candidates can choose their supervisors from other institutions in the Republic of Croatia and abroad – if that is, of course, justified given the specificity of the topic and the supervisor's competence – the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity plans the enrolment quotas in a responsible manner.

It is necessary to state the following: the re-accreditation principles as prescribed by the Agency for Science and Higher Education are based on the assumption that the doctoral studies in the Republic of Croatia are receiving an unconditional institutional support, and that they are integrated in the practice of the most developed national education systems. Of course, that is not correct. The Republic of Croatia accessed the European Union in 2013 and it is unrealistic to expect that in such a short amount of time – without a clear national vision or strategy – the doctoral study programmes can be formed in accordance with contemporary standards pertaining to systems with hundreds of years of experience.

The current enrolment policy is a realistic policy – the study programme is available to all candidates who apply and thereby meet the requirements of the call for application (4.0 GPA, knowledge of a foreign language, recommendation of a teacher). It is not possible to speak of specific processes of attracting excellent national and international candidates since: a) good higher education implies a stable social and political situation followed by institutional continuity; b) good higher education requires larger state investments; c) good higher education receives a constructive support of the institutions which provide it with good models and practices.

The Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity currently has no need to plan the enrolment quotas, and its teaching and supervisory capacities largely exceed the number of interested candidates.

The supervisor's responsibilities are described in more detail in sections 1.4. and 2.4.

3.2. The HEI establishes enrolment quotas on the basis of scientific, cultural, social, economic, and other needs

For several years, the enrolment quotas have been defined in line with reality. Considering the general economic and political movements in the Republic of Croatia, limited investment in science, slow and at times disabled advancement in academic ranks and similar threats in the area of humanities, the enrolment quotas are hard to plan in relation to any sort of criteria. In the 2013/2014 academic year, 8 doctoral candidates enrolled in the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, in the 2014/2015 academic year 4 doctoral candidates enrolled, in the 2015/2016 academic year likewise 4 also candidates enrolled. In the 2016/2017 academic year, there were no interested candidates.

3.3. The HEI establishes enrolment quotas taking into account the funding available to the candidates, that is, on the basis of the absorption potential of research projects or other sources of funding

Neither the doctoral candidates employed at the University, nor those who enrolled in the programme following their personal needs were financed from projects, or received funds from the economic nor any other public source. The enrolment quotas have no direct connection to the financial construction of the projects since – as has already been said – the programme was not conceived so as to rely on the projects provided by teachers.

3.4. The HEI should pay attention to the number of enroled candidates so as to provide each with an advisor (a potential supervisor). From the point of enrolment to the end of doctoral education, efforts are invested so that each candidate has a sustainable research plan and is able to complete doctoral research successfully

In the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity (Article 12 Paragraphs 1 and 2) it is stated that in the first semester the students are appointed a study advisor who can later take over as their supervisor. In practice, however, students rarely resort to the institution of the advisor. Reasons for this are various, but the most important one is that the programme does not require doctoral candidates to enrol with an outline of the doctoral dissertation or a developed research, for which they would require a study advisor/supervisor. Furthermore, the doctoral studies are not dependent project research, neither that of teachers nor doctoral candidates, which also constitutes a reason why the institution of the study advisor is used rarely or not at all. Instead, the doctoral candidates largely depend on the head of the programme (during the studies), and later – after the successful submission of the doctoral dissertation proposal – on the supervisor. Since the doctoral candidates are self-financed, the completion of the doctoral studies and the doctoral dissertation defence depend entirely on them, not on the Doctoral Degree Committee. Self-financing is the reason why a part of doctoral candidates still has not – although they should have – submitted a doctoral dissertation proposal nor started writing the doctoral dissertation.

3.5. The HEI ensures that interested, talented, and highly motivated candidates are recruited both nationally and internationally

Considering the global status of Humanities and the tendency to functionalize, measure, and define the pragmatic effects of knowledge, the doctoral studies focused on national philologies no longer have the same status as before - to say it figuratively - that of "guardians of the spirit." Considering the national context and the socio-political environment, insufficient funds allocated to science, restrictions in terms of advancement in research-teaching ranks, as well as in terms of new employment, the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity strives to maximally maintain the scientific standards within the present circumstances. Nevertheless, the current situation does not allow for international competency, therefore the call for application is related exclusively to the national level. The programme does not possess any - as stated in the re-accreditation principles - special mechanism for recruiting "the best prospective applicants." The best way of recruiting "the best undergraduate and graduate students leaning towards a career in research" is to absolve them from paying the tuition, the possibility of which is provided by the decision on the Research Fund of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, although so far no doctoral candidate has been financed from the Faculty's funds. However, one cannot claim that the enrolled candidates are not good. As with students everywhere, they possess different levels of motivation, but the doctoral candidates' portfolios and analyses of their extracurricular work show that they include excellent and highly motivated candidates.

3.6. The selection process of doctoral candidates is public and based on choosing the best applicants

The public call for application is published on the web page of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences and in daily press. The procedure of enrolment is described in the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity:

Article 7

1) Enrolment in doctoral studies is carried out based on a public call for application for enrolment in doctoral studies announced by the Faculty Council. A public call for application for enrolment to doctoral studies is published in the daily press and on the Faculty's web page at least one month before the beginning of doctoral studies.

(2) Those eligible for enrolment are:

- applicants who have completed university graduate studies in the area of humanities (academic field of philology) under the Bologna system;
- applicants who have completed the four-year university undergraduate studies in the field of humanities (academic field of philology) according to the study system that was in effect before 2005,
- applicants who hold a Master's degree in the area of humanities (pre-Bologna system),
- applicants who have completed the pre-Bologna Master's programme and passed or partially passed all required exams.

(3) For candidates who do not meet the criteria in paragraph 2 of this Article, the Doctoral Degree Committee will decide on their status on an individual basis.

Article 8

(1) The number of enrolment places (admission quotas) in doctoral studies is determined based on availability of research, teaching and supervisory capacities of the Faculty.

(2) If the number of candidates exceeds the number of vacancies (admission quota), an admission procedure will be conducted in order to select doctoral students. The admission procedure consists of evaluating the grade point average obtained from the completed graduate study programme, or university undergraduate level study programme and the candidates are enrolled in accordance with their respective place on the ranking list.

Article 9

(1) Doctoral studies can be enrolled by applicants who have completed graduate studies in the humanities with a grade point average not lower than 4.0.

(2) Applicants with a lower average may be accepted by exception with two letters of recommendation from university professors and on the basis of a decision of the Doctoral Degree Committee.

(3) Applicants must be proficient in at least one foreign language, and it is assumed that they have basic computer skills.

(4) Foreign nationals who have completed studies in the field of humanities at a foreign institution of higher education are eligible for enrolment in the studies by submitting two letters of recommendation from university professors and on the basis of a decision of the Doctoral Degree Committee.

Article 10

(1) On the basis of the established criteria in the previous article, the Doctoral Degree Committee compiles a ranking list of selected candidates for enrolment in doctoral studies and publishes it on the noticeboard and on the Faculty's web page.

(2) Applicants who have obtained the right of enrolment in full-time doctoral studies and are employed by the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek as assistants or junior researchers do not participate in the costs of doctoral studies, i.e. do not pay a tuition fee.

(3) In the case that the doctoral studies are enrolled by a person in the associate position of assistant working as an assistant at a public research institute, whose costs of doctoral studies are not covered by the public research institute's own revenues but by the state budget, consent for the conclusion of the contract of employment is given by the Minister.

(4) If the Minister does not issue approval for conclusion of the contract of employment mentioned in the previous article, the applicant shall sign a contract on studying with payment and is entitled to enrol in part-time doctoral studies.

(5) Applicants who have obtained the right of enrolment in part-time doctoral studies sign a contract on studying with payment. The contract on studying between the Faculty and the applicant who has earned the right of enrolment in part-time doctoral studies regulates the mutual rights and responsibilities during doctoral studies.

(6) Foreign nationals may enrol under the same conditions as Croatian citizens if they have completed appropriate studies at a foreign higher education institution and have accumulated at least 300 ECTS credits at undergraduate and graduate levels taking into account the criteria of the transfer of ECTS credits.

(7) After applying for enrolment, an applicant who has obtained a diploma at a foreign university shall, at his or her own expense, submit the decision issued by the competent authority regarding the academic recognition of foreign higher education qualifications and recognition of periods of study, i.e. ECTS credits for the purpose of enrolment in doctoral studies.

The study programme does not require the candidates to enrol with a doctoral dissertation proposal nor a research plan developed a few years beforehand. On the one hand, the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity was not conceived in such manner. On the other hand, such a procedure for obtaining a doctoral degree requires a transition period to be defined and announced. In addition, the preparation of applicants is necessary since, based on the contemporary level of awareness of Croatian doctoral candidates on the continuity of the undergraduate, graduate, and postgraduate studies, it is hard to expect a "prepared" applicant with a clear vision on what exactly they wish to do professionally. Moreover, an attempt to start preparing the doctoral dissertation proposal during the second semester of studies has failed through due to the unpreparedness of doctoral candidates to articulate the topic of their doctoral research at the beginning of their studies.

The Postgraduate University Study Literature and Cultural Identity does not require an interview with the applicants nor the submission of a motivational letter as an integral part of the enrolment procedure.

3.7. The HEI ensures that the selection procedure is transparent and in line with published criteria, and that there is a transparent complaints procedure

The Study Programme and the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity (Articles 9 and 10) define the minimal requirements that the applicant must meet in order to enrol:

- a) Doctoral studies can be enrolled by applicants who have completed graduate studies in the humanities with a grade point average not lower than 4.0.
- b) Applicants with a lower average may be accepted by exception with two letters of recommendation from university professors and on the basis of a decision of the Doctoral Degree Committee.

c) Applicants must be proficient in at least one foreign language, and it is assumed that they have basic computer skills.

The enrolment in the doctoral studies is based on the public call for application issued by the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek. After the application deadline has expired, the Doctoral Degree Committee examines the received applications and, based on the enrolment conditions and criteria, chooses future doctoral candidates.

Following the selection procedure, the list of accepted candidates is published on the programme web page.

Applicants who have obtained the right of enrolment become enrolled in the programme, whereby they sign a contract with the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek.

The applicant who has not gained the right to enrol must receive a written explanation of the Doctoral Degree Committee. The applicant has the right to complain within the legally prescribed period of time, whereby they have free access to the documentation pertaining to the public call for the publication. The head of the programme and members of the Doctoral Degree Committee interview the applicant.

3.8. There is a possibility to recognize the prior learning of applicants and candidates

In certain cases, it is possible to recognize the applicants' prior achievements, thus enabling them to obtain a doctoral degree outside the doctoral studies. If, for instance, the candidate has completed the pre-Bologna Master's programme and passed or partially passed all required exams, their prior achievements are recognized, whereby they are obliged to attend the courses *Academic Writing, Ethical Standards of Research*, and *Writing a Doctoral Dissertation Proposal*, and two elective courses from the first semestral module.

The Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity define the rule of conduct in those cases when the candidate's achievements are such so as to enable them to obtain a doctoral degree outside the doctoral studies:

Article 11

(3) On the basis of the decision of the Faculty Council and with the consent of the Senate, an individual who has accomplished scientific achievements, which by their significance meet the requirements for obtaining academic ranks, may obtain a doctoral degree without enrolment in doctoral studies through the public defence of their written doctoral dissertation.

(4) Scientific achievements are realized by fulfilling the conditions in accordance with the Law and special regulations for appointment to the lowest academic rank of research associate in the corresponding scientific field and discipline.

In such cases, the Doctoral Degree Committee appoints an independent committee consisting of three members who prepare a report on the applicant's achievements and determine whether the applicant's work meets the criteria needed for the appointment into the lowest research rank (that of an assistant professor). The report is then forwarded to the Rectorate of the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of Osijek, which gives or does not give its consent for obtaining a doctoral degree outside the doctoral studies.

3.9. The candidates' rights and obligations are defined in relevant HEI regulations and a contract on studying that provides for a high level of supervisory and institutional support to the candidates

Two fundamental documents regulate the relationship between the head of the programme and the students. Those are the Study Programme of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity and the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, which are aligned with the Ordinance on Postgraduate Studies at the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of Osijek. Articles 16 to 19 of the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, which are aligned with the Ordinance on Postgraduate Studies at the Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of Osijek. Articles 16 to 19 of the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity describe the doctoral candidates' rights and regulations:

Article 16

(1) When enrolling in doctoral studies a student signs a contract with the Faculty on mutual rights and responsibilities.

(2) The contract contains provisions on the contracting parties, the financial obligations of the student, the responsibilities in terms of enrolment and completion, and other issues relevant to the studies.

(3) By signing the contract and paying the agreed financial obligations, the applicant acquires the status of a doctoral studies student. The student completes the studies by defending a doctoral dissertation.

(4) The student of doctoral studies is required to carry out curricular and extracurricular activities defined by the study program which according to the ECTS credit system enable him or her to progress in doctoral studies.

(5) The doctoral student has the right to change the supervisor or the topic once, on submission of a written request to the Doctoral Degree Committee and a statement by the person who has acted as supervisor.

(6) Prior to the dissertation defence, the doctoral student is required to have at least one published or accepted for publication scholarly work thematically related to the doctoral research of which he or she is the author or co-author.

Article 17

(1) The student is entitled to a leave of absence:

- during pregnancy,
- during the use of maternity or parental leave in accordance with a special regulation,
- during a longer illness preventing him or her from fulfilling study responsibilities,
- during an international exchange period of more than 60 days during the course of study, unless the student gains ECTS credits through the international exchange,
- in other justified cases, in accordance with the decision of the Doctoral Degree Committee.

(2) A student may exercise the right to a leave of absence only if he or she submits, within 30 days from the date of the onset of the circumstances that have led to the request for the leave of absence, a written request for approval of a leave of absence to the Doctoral Degree Committee with credible documentation of the justification of the request.

(3) The decision on approving the student's leave of absence is made by the Doctoral Degree Committee.

(4) During the leave of absence, the student is entitled to take examinations for which he or she has fulfilled requirements, and the period of leave of absence will not be counted in the duration of study.

Article 18

1) The student who has lost doctoral student status due to the interruption of study can resume his or her studies provided that not more than three years have passed from the date of interruption of study and that the study program was not substantially altered (over 20%) from that enrolled by the student.

(2) The application to resume studies after an interruption of studies is submitted for approval to the Doctoral Degree Committee with the Student Transcript Book ("Indeks") and certificate of the completed part of the doctoral studies programme.

(3) The approval to resume studies after an interruption of studies is granted by the Doctoral Degree Committee, and shall include the approval of the continuation of the studies and the recognition of the examinations along with the grades and ECTS credits earned during the study and tuition fee amount which is determined according to the generation of students with whom the student continues his or her studies.

Article 19

(1) A student who has interrupted the doctoral studies can submit a specific request for a certificate from the Faculty on fulfilment of his or her duties during the doctoral studies and the accumulated ECTS credits.

(2) The certificate can only be obtained if the doctoral student has attended the classes, met the requirements for being granted the signature of the teacher and passed the exams in the courses covered by the semester module after which the study was interrupted.

(3) The certificate referred to in paragraph 1 of this Article is issued by the Doctoral Degree Committee.

The doctoral candidates are informed on their rights and obligations in a number of ways:

- a) The web page features a PowerPoint presentation *Preuzmi KIKI* [Download KIKI²⁴] containing essential information on the programme.
- b) The web page also features the study programme and the Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, therefore the candidates can inform themselves, even before enrolling, on all relevant concerns regarding the programme structure, as well as on their rights and obligations
- c) The guidelines for the doctoral candidates present an abbreviated description of the programme given to students upon enrolment.
- d) Prior to the beginning of instruction, the head of the programme welcomes the doctoral candidates, explains the programme structure to them, and answers their questions.
- e) The head of the programme is in direct and electronic contact with the doctoral candidates for the entire period of their studies.

3.10. There are institutional support mechanisms for the candidates' successful progression Current forms of institutional support:

- a) Delivery of instruction is coordinated with the doctoral candidate's circumstances.
- b) A limited part of curricular activities is organized in the form of lectures; the rest is delivered through individual-advisory sessions.
- c) Upon enrolling in the programme, the doctoral candidates gain access to all databases to which the Faulty of Humanities and Social Sciences is subscribed.²⁵

- d) The doctoral candidates are invited to co-operate with the *Anafora* journal, issued following the initiative of the Department of Croatian Language and Literature by the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences which has recently been cited in the WoS.
- e) At the fourth session of the Faculty Council, held on 25 January 2017, a decision was issued on the Research Fund of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek providing support for the doctoral candidates: a) 1.500,00 HRK for national conferences during the entire period of studying; b) 3.000,00 HRK for international conferences during the entire period of studying.

4. PROGRAMME AND OUTCOMES

4.1. The content and quality of the doctoral programme are aligned with internationally accepted standards

Although it seems so, the meaning of the phrase "internationally accepted standards" is not clear. The institutions expected to do so (Ministry of Science and Education, Agency for Science and Higher Education) have not prescribed the minimal criteria for the structuring of doctoral studies in the Republic of Croatia according to which they would follow the international standards. Likewise, no international institution embodying the international standards (e.g. World University Rankings or the ShanghaiRanking Academic Ranking of World Universities) has been singled out. In 2017, the brochure *Quality Assurance in Doctoral Education in Croatia* was issued including the subtitle *Recommendations and Good Practice Examples*. Nevertheless, no positive document has ever, for instance, prescribed the supervisor's unconditional exclusion from the process of evaluation and defence of the doctoral dissertation, although the principles for the evaluation of doctoral studies argue that the studies in which the supervisor does not participate in these committees will be evaluated more highly. Also, it is considered that the supervisor should attend the so-called "School for Supervisors," although no one knows what kind of school that is exactly and what its contents are.

The thematic evaluation conducted in 2013 by the Agency for Science and Higher Education has resulted in the *Report on the Thematic Evaluation of Doctoral Studies in the Republic of Croatia* (February 2014. REG.NO.: 355-06-03—14-18; CLASS: 602-04/12-05/0002). The report concludes by listing the shortcomings of the doctoral studies (for instance, the lack of mechanisms for monitoring the supervisor, the lack of additional conditions for the appointment of the supervisor, the lack of mechanisms for attracting the best prospective candidates, the lack of true interdisciplinarity, low mobility of doctoral candidates, only 9.5% of programmes require the research outline etc.), after which it demands a "necessary and urgent comprehensive reform of doctoral studies which would encompass all universities and study programmes." However, there is no positive legal document ordering the reform of doctoral studies which would – not as a possibility, but as a *conditio sine qua non* – entail the following "internationally accepted standards," as systematised by the author of this Self-Evaluation upon reviewing the international doctoral studies:

- a) The key condition for the enrolment of candidates in the doctoral programme is the "content and research quality" with which the candidate applies (a report consisting of 100.000 words)
- b) The doctoral candidate should be provided with an individual approach adjusted to the doctoral research
- c) The supervisor must be excluded from the process of evaluating the research proposal and the doctoral dissertation defence
- d) The supervisor must be determined based on criteria such as, for instance, the h-index or the *impact* factor; they have to be "internationally visible"
- e) The doctoral research must be related to projects.

To meet the aforementioned criteria, wider social preconditions and the support of institutions in charge of the doctoral studies are necessary. It is not enough to provide examples of good practice and to evaluate the doctoral studies in accordance with those examples. For instance, in order for the doctoral research to be linked to projects, the ways of granting projects, forms of scholarship, and the number of project providers need to be restructured at state level.

The comparison of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity with a certain international Humanities programme can be general and concern the organization of doctoral

studies following the Bologna Declaration. As for other parallels, it is not possible to draw them – or they are only partial – especially given the contents which are linked in every study programme to, among other things, national themes, as well as to teachers and their professional interests, which should serve as the basis for the recognisability of the studies.

Currently – considering the socio-economical context and the modest position of humanities, not only in the Republic of Croatia but worldwide – the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity certainly achieves the following "internationally accepted standards:"

- 1. The duration of the programme is three years
- 2. The value of work in the programme is expressed in ECTS credits (180 in total)
- 3. There is a limited number of core courses (*Identity, Academic Writing, Ethical Standards of Research, Writing a Doctoral Dissertation Proposal*), the doctoral candidates choose the rest of the courses according to their personal interests, thus independently organizing the content of the studies
- 4. The extracurricular activities by means of which the doctoral candidate develops research and generic skills make up for 70% of the activities and carry 120 ECTS credits
- 5. The doctoral candidate may be appointed a study advisor
- 6. The supervisor does not participate in the evaluation of the doctoral dissertation proposal, nor in the evaluation and defence of the doctoral dissertation
- 7. The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences organized three supervisory workshops for all the teaching staff involved in the programme (the European Charter for Researchers, ethical standards of research, bibliometric indicators)
- 8. The candidates are systematically educated on the ethical standards of research (a special course which they attend in the fifth semester)
- Based on the signed Agreement on Co-operation of Postgraduate Studies between the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek and the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Zagreb, the doctoral candidates are enabled to attend courses from other doctoral studies (mobility)
- 10. Prior to formal submission of the doctoral dissertation proposal, the doctoral candidates present the proposal before an independent committee
- 11. Prior to the doctoral dissertation defence, the doctoral candidate must publish a paper in a national or international journal.

Although the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity is not conceived as a programme in which the candidates would enrol with a developed research, but they reach the dissertation topic during the studies, we shall say that the programme is not comparable to the "internationally accepted standards" due to following reasons:

- 1. There are no mechanisms for attracting the best prospective candidates (the institution does not have enough disposable funds)
- 2. During the enrolment procedure, the candidates are not interviewed nor required to submit a motivational letter
- 3. The doctoral candidate does not enrol in the programme with a research proposal developed beforehand
- 4. The doctoral research is not related to the projects.

Among the listed shortcomings, the second one it is the easiest to rectify, which is what we plan to do.

4.2. Programme learning outcomes, as well as the learning outcomes of its modules and subject units, are aligned with the level 8.2 of the CroQF. They clearly describe the competencies the candidates will develop during the doctoral programme, including the ethical requirements of doing research

During the process of composing the amendments to the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, the fundamental programme outcomes were defined:

- 1. Knowledge of different methodological and interpretative paradigms
- 2. Critical relationship toward the subject literature
- 3. Retroflection (the relationship between text and context, ideas, constructs etc.)
- 4. Issues of identity and its formation
- 5. Literature and media
- 6. Research methodology and genres of the academic prose
- 7. Awareness on ethical principles in research, plagiarism and forgery
- 8. Openness to all forms of the Other (concerning race, sex, gender, community, religion etc.).

During the structuring of the programme, the following was taken into account: since the semestral modules are organized by topics, the teachers were asked to offer courses of synthetic nature (an epoch, era, style, literary school, interpretative approach, genre) or to structure narrowly specialist courses. The first decision was conditioned by the wish for the doctoral candidates – especially in the first semester devoted to research methodology, but also later – to upgrade and broaden their existing knowledge, to accustom themselves to considering the facts in a broader context, and to familiarize with certain methodological paradigms to which they were not introduced during their undergraduate and graduates studies, or which they learned about only in passing. The second decision – narrowly specialist courses – was defined based on the fact that doctoral candidates should be instructed on how to deal with a specific literary phenomenon, how to reach a general conclusion while researching the individual and minuscule cases. Generally, the doctoral candidates are able to upgrade the existing and acquire new knowledge and to develop the tools and analytic skills necessary for writing the doctoral candidates attend the course *Ethical Standards of Research* that provides them with knowledge on the concepts of authorship, plagiarism, autoplagiarism, forgery etc.

Special attention was given to a detailed description of courses: description of the goal(s), learning outcomes, detailed presentation of contents, type of instruction, the doctoral candidates' obligations and monitoring of their work (allocation of ECTS credits in accordance with the activities), evaluation, and obligatory and additional literature.

The learning outcomes correspond entirely with the level 8.2. of the Croatian Qualifications Framework, whereby the psychomotor skills should be disregarded since they do not pertain to philological studies. As shown in the table containing learning outcomes, the programme outcomes are divided into four groups: Knowledge and understanding; Application of knowledge and understanding; Analysis, deduction, decision-making; Synthesis and evaluation. Their contents correspond with that which the Croatian Qualifications Framework describes as Knowledge (study programme: Knowledge and understanding), Cognitive, psychomotor, and social skills (Application of knowledge and understanding), Independency (Analysis, deduction, decision-making), and Responsibility (Synthesis and evaluation).

The extent to which certain course outcomes – and consequently the study programme outcomes – are achieved is most visible in the form of seminars (demonstrated by the doctoral candidates' portfolios). They present an important form of independent work: in them, the doctoral candidates exercise the interpretation paradigms, offer interpretations, make use of literature in order to support their views, but

also to show how they deviate or essentially diverge from the existing interpretations etc. Maybe the highest value of such form of work lies in the fact that the candidates are preparing for the process of writing the doctoral dissertation, articulating their thoughts in a more extensive form, and practicing their critical relationship toward that what they read, enabling them to independently form their own literary and aesthetic viewpoint and support it with arguments.

An additional effort to achieve the learning outcomes was invested in trying to predict which educational and student activities help achieve which outcome and how one can ultimately evaluate it. Here is an example based on the core course *Identity*:

The best indicator that the study programme outcomes are indeed realized are the doctoral candidates' published papers, written independently or in co-operation with a teacher, as well as their participation in scientific conferences. The results are presented in sections 4.4. and 4.8.

4.3. Programme learning outcomes are logically and clearly connected with teaching contents, as well as the contents included in supervision and research

The general aim of the programme is the doctoral candidate's development of the ability to think critically, interpret scientifically, and write articulately. These outcomes are present in various forms in the descriptions of all courses. Although at first (during the process of amending the study programme) the general learning outcomes at the programme level directed the selection of course contents, eventually they have resulted – naturally – from the outcomes of specific courses (or a group of courses). The comparison of learning outcomes at the level of a specific course and the outcomes at the level of the study programme shows that there are no programme outcomes which we would not be able to find at the level of outcomes of a certain course. Finally, each described outcome was structured in precise language, taking into account the use of verbs describing a specific form of knowledge or a skill; it is clear which competence we are referring to, and none of the outcomes is abstract. If at times one comes across an outcome more suitable for a lower qualification level, not the level 8 (for example, define the basic genealogic concepts, define the corpus of the 16th century Croatian pastoral, assess to which classification group a literary work belongs to), those are exceptions inevitable in projects such as this one.

The list of learning outcomes pertaining to individual courses was prepared as the Annex 10.

4.4. The doctoral programme ensures the achievement of learning outcomes and competencies aligned with the level 8.2 of the CroQF

The quality achievement of learning outcomes (both at the level of individual courses and at the programme level) depends on numerous factors. Firstly, that is the excellence of the teacher and their ability to transfer knowledge, as well as the doctoral candidates' motivation. This "golden formula" is not always achievable, which is probably the case with the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity (a number of doctoral candidates who have not submitted the doctoral dissertation proposal or published any papers etc.). The Bologna system does not acknowledge the pre-Bologna Master's degree, which presented a sort of transition between the graduate and postgraduate level in the old higher education system since the candidates' thesis had to show that they mastered the ways of acquiring information and critically assessing the literature, as well as written articulation of the thesis in an extensive form. Due to this, the Bologna system – regardless of the theoretically ideal doctoral candidate, who is entirely independent and ready – experiences problems especially concerning the establishment of the scientific and ethical authority. The Bologna system has fragmented and scattered the knowledge, and although the education lasts for five years and is finalized with a magisterial thesis (only by name, not in terms of the theoretical conceptualization), the concept does not provide students with time or ability to learn how to develop an idea or a thesis in more that twenty standard pages of text.

The Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity has recognized this flaw of the Bologna system, therefore its structure is as follows. Through a selection of different courses – which do not necessarily directly relate to the future topic of the doctoral dissertation – the doctoral candidates are given the time and space for studying in the true sense of the word. They are enabled to familiarize with various scientific topic and – most importantly – interpretational approaches. The individual-advisory instruction – allocating only a small portion of time to the conventional form of teacher-student interaction, while a greater part is reserved for writing the seminar based on a certain issue and relying on the relevant literature – helps the students to and become as ready as possible for writing the doctoral dissertation, at which point their issue will not consist in "how to write 200 standard pages of text." Instead, they will concentrate on the explication of their thesis, aim, and methodology.

That such a structure of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity is generally good – although it should be improved and its shortcomings rectified – that is, that the programme outcomes are being realized, is most certainly proved by the doctoral candidates' papers, written both independently or in co-operation with a teacher. Their participation in national and international scientific conferences confirms that the doctoral candidates are acquiring the competencies that enable them to conduct an independent research, to critically assess, accept or reject a thesis, and finally, that they are ready to present their results before an audience.

4.5. Teaching methods (and ECTS credits, if applicable) are appropriate for level 8.2 of the CroQF and assure achievement of clearly defined learning outcomes

Within the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity, the doctoral candidates acquire 60 ECTS credits by passing the core and elective courses, and 120 ECTS credits through extracurricular activities (ratio 30% : 70%). Consequently, the individual work is emphasized, which requires the operalization of knowledge (acquired previously or during the course) and its presentation. The activities are characterized by different intellectual and cognitive intensity and are all compliant with the level 8.2. of the CroQF, since each activity requires the candidates to acquire new knowledge and present it to various types of recipients, wherein the doctoral candidates also demonstrate their level of development of generic skills. The study programme (section 3.16.) emphasises precisely this aspect:

The amended elaboration of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity proposes the forms of a more active inclusion of doctoral candidates in the delivery of instruction at the undergraduate and graduate studies, an independent research work (writing and publishing of original, review, and professional articles, compilation of biographies), participation in scientific conferences, as well as of inclusion in research projects, in the extent to which it is possible considering the pace of project applications and financing in the Republic of Croatia. The amended programme introduces courses that enable students to develop competencies in the field of academic prose genres and research methodology, as well as basic knowledge on authorship and academic plagiarism (courses *Academic Writing* and *Ethical Standards of Research*). Finally, the models of acquiring ECTS credits through extracurricular activities have been devised, thereby significantly increasing the share of independent research work, which greatly contributes to achieving the ultimate goal – writing of the doctoral dissertation.

Considering the small number of doctoral candidates, at times only a single candidate elects a certain course, which opens the path toward an individual approach. The course *Writing a Doctoral Dissertation Proposal* – attended at the beginning of the fifth semester – is delivered in its smallest part as a lecture (two hours devoted to the formal aspects of submitting the doctoral dissertation proposal and its constituents), and is mainly organized in the form of a group discussion. Namely, the doctoral candidate presents the research proposal while the teacher and other candidates comment, make suggestions, ask questions etc. The surveys have confirmed that doctoral candidates consider this method of work to be very useful.

4.6. The study programme enables the acquisition of generic (transferable) skills

The most important generic skills that the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity wishes to develop in doctoral candidates are teamwork, organizational and management skills, analytical skills and production of new ideas, and criticism and ethicality in research (satanization of plagiarism and consideration of broader usefulness of research). However, it should be noted that the development of these skills does not start at the doctoral studies, but that they are upgraded during the doctoral programme, to the extent to which the doctoral candidate is ready to develop. The study programme offers the assumptions, but the level of their realization depends not only on the programme delivery but also on the doctoral candidates' individual characteristics, motivation, and aspirations.

The individual-advisory instruction largely contributes to the independency of doctoral candidates concerning the presentation of their own ideas and suggestion, but the real training ground for their exercise of generic skills are the extracurricular activities – presenting before undergraduate and graduate students or participants at scientific conferences. Writing of scientific articles and familiarizing with the type of responsibility toward "mute listeners" (reviewers, potential recipients) presents and important step in the development of all abovementioned skills.

Internet has severely multiplied the sources, thus allowing the path toward plagiarism and making it increasingly hard to detect. In order to sharpen the negative perception of unethical scientific behaviour and prevent plagiarism, the candidates are obliged to attend the course *Ethical Standards of Research*. The course introduces them to the concepts of the author, plagiarist, pirate, and intellectual property, to the boundaries of origin and processing, and to differences between student and academic plagiarism such as complete plagiarism, autoplagiarism, plagiarism by translation, *copy&paste* plagiarism, paraphrasing without a reference, and citing outside the context.

The Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity uses the Ephorus antiplagiarism software. Also, the doctoral candidates are offered a possibility to giving a lecture at the "Open Thursday," a series of lectures organized each semester and held on a monthly basis, every last Thursday. The project is not restricted in terms of the topic: the lecturers choose the topics themselves, but it is important that they present them in a popular manner. The following doctoral candidates used the possibility of presenting at the "Open Thursday:"

- Dejan Varga: Fikcija ili stvarnost film kao prikaz suvremenih teorija identiteta [Fiction or Fact Film as a Representation of Contemporary Identity Theories], 29 May 2014. The course Identity inspired the lecture.
- Sanja Matković: *U čemu je privlačnost kriminalističkih romana*? [*What Makes Crime Fiction So Appealing*?], 23 February 2017. The course *Popular Literature* inspired the lecture.
- Jelena Pataki: Tko je ovdje lud i zašto? Gotička književnost i »Koža u kojoj živim« Pedra Almodóvara [Who Is Truly Mad Here? Gothic Literature and Pedro Almodóvar's "The Skin I Live in"], 25 May 2017.²⁶ The course Gothic Literature inspired the lecture.

4.7. Teaching content is adapted to the needs of current and future research and candidates' training (individual course plans, generic skills, etc.)

Since the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity was not devised on a project platform, whereby the doctoral candidates are not expected to enrol with a developed research plan and topic, the teaching contents are organized in four semester modules. Consequently, the candidates are offered not only different topics (research methodology, literary heritage, drama and theatre, literature and other media), but – more importantly – different approaches and interpretation paradigms, ranging from traditional philology (textology), to classic comparative approaches, all the way to modern theoretical concepts of identity, nation, gender, and sex. The variety of approaches undoubtedly help the doctoral candidates while choosing their research topic and methodological conceptualization.

Except for the four core courses (*Academic Writing, Identity, Ethical Standards of Research, Writing a Doctoral Dissertation Proposal*), the doctoral candidates independently elect the courses which they will attend between the second and fourth semester. Their choice is free and – we suppose – defined by their subjective professional interest and the topic of future doctoral dissertation, of course, to the extent to which they have a vision of the doctoral research. The doctoral candidates can also independently create the extracurricular part of the studies since – except for two cases: a published scientific paper and participation in one scientific conference in the Republic of Croatia – they have access to various extracurricular activities. The activities require different amounts of time and effort, thus carrying the different number of ECTS credits. The doctoral candidates fulfil the extracurricular activities at their own pace. Furthermore, the doctoral candidates can attend courses – of their own choice – at the doctoral studies delivered by the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Zagreb, with which the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, as well for developing the knowledge acquired at the undergraduate and graduate level of studies.

4.8. The programme ensures quality through international connections and teacher and candidate mobility

The study programme enables the doctoral candidate to spend at least three months at a doctoral study programme abroad, for which they will be awarded 20 ECTS credits. Among the five generations enrolled in the programme so far, none of the candidates made use of this possibility.

The study programme included the following international lecturers:

Participation in national and international scientific conferences (independently or in co-authorship with a teacher) represents a part of the extracurricular activities. Participation in a conference in the Republic of Croatia is an obligatory extracurricular activity and is awarded 15 ECTS credits; participation in an international conference is awarded 20 ECTS credits. The doctoral candidates can obtain information on the scientific manifestations at the Science Portal of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences or in other ways. As described in sections 2.9. and 3.10., the doctoral candidates are thereby supported with 1.500,00 HRK for national conferences, and 3.000,00 for international conference during the entire period of studying.

The Regulations on the Implementation of the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity define the doctoral dissertation, and among other, provide the possibility of writing the dissertation in another world language.

Article 25

(1) The doctoral dissertation must be an independent and original work, which demonstrates independent scientific research with application of scientific methods and makes a scientific contribution in the academic field of humanities, academic discipline of philology.

(2) The doctoral dissertation is a public research work and is subject to public scholarly assessment.

(3) Forms of doctoral dissertation can be:

- research work monography,
- research work based on published articles.

(4) The doctoral dissertation is written in the Croatian standard language and may be written in one of the world's languages with the approval of the Faculty Council.

(5) The title, abstract and keywords of the doctoral dissertation must be written in the Croatian and English language. The abstract should provide an understanding of the objective of the doctoral dissertation, methods of research, results and conclusions.

(6) The doctoral dissertation is submitted in electronic and printed form.

So far, two doctoral candidates used the possibility of writing the doctoral dissertation in English: Ljubica Matek (*The Family in Contemporary English Language Fiction 1980–2008*, Supervisor: Dr. Robert Sullivan, Full Professor, Brown University Providence, USA; defended on 12 October 2012) and Jadranka Zlomislić (*The Politics of Higher Education and American Academic Fiction 1950–1980*, Supervisor: Dr. Myrl Jones, Professor Emeritus, Radford University, Radford, VA, USA; defended on 18 May 2012). Both are employees of the Department of English Literature and Language at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Osijek.

Instructions for Designing a Doctoral Dissertation

INSTRUCTIONS FOR DESIGNING A DOCTORAL DISSERTATION in the Postgraduate University Study Programme Literature and Cultural Identity

The doctoral dissertation is to be written in the standard Croatian language.

The doctoral dissertation can be written in another world language (English, German).

The text of the doctoral dissertation must be grammatically correct and free from spelling mistakes, as well as from typos.

The dissertation should be written on A4 (210x297) size papers. It is recommended to write the chapter titles in bold capitals (**BOLD**), and subchapter titles in small letters.

The text on each page must be logically divided into paragraphs (not too long nor too short).

The pages must be numbered. They are counted from the introduction until the end of the work. Numbers are to be placed in the bottom right corner.

The submitted doctoral dissertation must be hardcover.

ILLUSTRATIONS (tables and images)

All tables and images (charts, photographs, drawings, schemes, diagrams, maps etc.) should be numbered and have an adequate title.

Table numbers and titles are always to be placed above the table.

Image numbers and titles are always to be placed above the image.

If an illustration does not represent the author's original contribution, the author is obliged to provide the source (if the illustration has not been published yet), i.e. the author of the illustration (if the illustration has been published) from whom it was taken. The source is to be listed immediately below the illustration.

If an illustration is a reproduction of a work of art, the following information is to be provided: the author (if known), title, and other data relevant for a specific art work.

CITATION

It is a general rule that all written works must always clearly differentiate between someone else's text, knowledge, and data, and the author's text, conclusions, knowledge, ideas, data etc. Limited parts of other authors' texts can be used, but they must always be pointed out in a visible manner.

Parts of someone else's work should be separated from the rest of the text by means of quotation marks, *italic font*, or otherwise.

Doctoral candidates should look for a detailed guideline on citation and referencing in the adequate literature dominant in a specific profession (Harvard style of citation and referencing, Oxford referencing style, the Chicago Manual Style etc.).

<u>COMPONENTS OF THE DISSERTATION</u> A cover in the language of the dissertation.

Followed by a cover in English, if the dissertation is not written in English; if it is, the second cover is to be in Croatian.

A cover in Croatian with the data on the supervisor(s).

A cover in English with the data on the supervisor(s).

Information on the supervisor(s).

Acknowledgments (optional).

Abstract in the language of the dissertation.

The abstract must be written on one text page and enable the reader to comprehend the aim of the work, research methods, results with important argumentation, and the author's conclusions. The abstract is to be followed by keywords.

An extended (structured) abstract in English if the dissertation is not written in English (maximum of 10 pages), keywords.

An extended (structured) abstract in Croatian if the dissertation is not written in Croatian (maximum of 10 pages), keywords.

STRUCTURE OF THE DISSERTATION

Table of Contents Text of the Dissertation (starting with the Introduction) Conclusion Bibliography

A list of all works cited in the dissertation, as well as those which the doctoral candidate refers to.

The list must not include the works which were not cited or refered to in the dissertation.

If required by the topic, the candidate is to separate the primary bibliography (works) and secondary bibliography. To be listed in the alphabetical order (by the authors' surnames).

Attachments

If the dissertation includes attachments (published works, surveys, forms etc.), they are to be added at the end of the dissertation. They can be titled as Annex A, Annex B... or Annex 1, Annex 2 etc.

Curriculum Vitae

Curriculum Vitae should be written in third person singular, and should not be longer than 1800 characters. Curriculum Vitae should include the list of published works (if there are any).
